

Peace, Unity and Love

As I write this, I do so on the same day that Chester Diocesan Synod had their most recent meeting. At that meeting there was a special guest, Bishop William, the Bishop of Boga. Visiting from one of our link dioceses, he is in this diocese for a week. He spoke to the synod meeting, and at the end was asked by Bishop Mark how we could pray for him and the Diocese of Aru Boga.

Bishop William's answer was that prayers could be for peace, unity and love. That request was for him, and his diocese, but it seems to me, perhaps especially this Christmastime, that it's a prayer that we might pray not just for the diocese of Boga, but for ourselves, and for the whole world.

We have a world where the climate crisis is becoming ever more urgent. A world which seems to have more and more countries at war each month at the moment. We have a world where those of different faiths are often in conflict. Where Christians have disagreed, and continue to disagree, to the point that we have many different denominations. And a Church of England which has people threatening will split over the issue of same-sex relationships.

Yet, in amidst all of this pain, disarray and vulnerability, we celebrate this month the birth of the Prince of Peace. Immanuel, *God with us*. When, in the world or in our own lives, things seem to be ever more desperate, we can be assured that peace, unity and love can all be found - illuminated by the light of the world.

*Word made flesh, life of the world, in your incarnation you embraced our poverty: by your Spirit may we share in your riches.
Amen.*
